- 1) Be currently enrolled as an undergraduate in a college or university program or about to enter such a program;
- 2) Include a resume which indicates a strong interest and commitment to community service;
- 3) Maintain a minimum 3.0 grade point average verified by either an official or unofficial transcript;
- 4) Submit two letters of recommendation; (Must be sealed in separate envelopes and signed across the back)
- 5) Discuss in no more than 500 words how your current and future service to your community will have a positive impact on Middle Eastern culture and heritage in the USA.
- 6) Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident living in NY or NJ.
- 7) Be of Middle Eastern descent.

The Awards for Community Service are presented to deserving candidates whose commitment to community service reflects the mission and goals of the Salaam Club of NY. The Salaam Club Scholarship Committee will determine the strongest and most worthy applicants based on their fulfillment of all requirements. Grants of \$1,000 are given annually to students who are actively involved in or plan to participate in Middle Eastern heritage and/or community or public service. Examples of activities include volunteering in a non-profit organization, preparing for Foreign Service, clerking for a judge, running for office in school (HS or College), working in a soup kitchen or running outreach events in your church or religious community.
